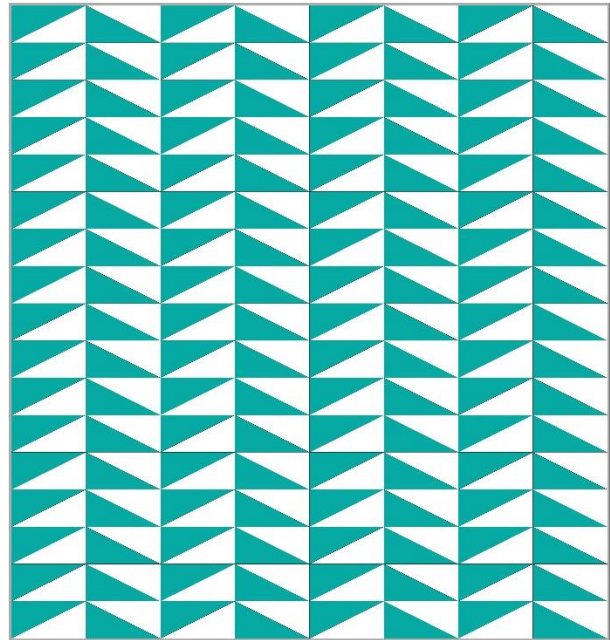


HRT Turquoise Quilt

****This pattern is written for solid fabrics where the front & back look the same.****

This is a simple one-block half-rectangle triangle quilt using. To make this quilt, I used a Bloc Loc HRT ruler set to help with trimming, and 24 fatquarters of solid fabric (FQ = 18" x 20"). I used the following Kona cotton color pairs:

Teal Blue + Seascape
Jade Green + Bahama Blue
Cyan + Dusty Blue
Carribbean + Candy Green
Lagoon + Aqua
Glacie + Jamaica
Ultra Marine + Waterfall
Turquoise + Aloha
Breakers + Capri
Oasis + Pool
Sage + Aruba
Peacock + Azure



Cutting Instructions

Create pairs of light and dark FQ.

From 11 of the pairs, cut 3 strips 5" x 20".

From the last pair, cut 1 strip 5" x 20".

Sub cut the strips in to rectangle pairs @ 5" x 10". You should have 68 pairs of rectangles.

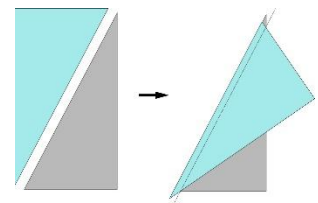
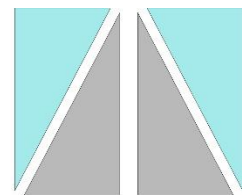
Cut the pairs in half diagonally. Because I used solid fabric, it did not matter which direction I cut the diagonal.

Sewing Instructions

From each rectangle pair of fabric (that is now cut in 4 triangles), you will need to assemble half of your pairs with the seam going up to the right, and half with it going up to the left (see diagram at right).

****Note:** You will have to turn the fabric in one set of HRT over to get the seams to angle the correct way. This is why this pattern only works for solid fabric.

To sew the HRT together, flip the triangle with its short edge at the top of the block over and line it up on top of the second triangle with the points hanging off a little. Sew the triangles together along the diagonal using a 1/4" seam allowance and press to the dark fabric.



Trimming Instructions

Using the Bloc Loc ruler set, trim the HRT blocks to 4 ½" x 8 ½".

Laying Out the Quilt Top

After trimming, I sorted my blocks into 6 piles of 11 – 12 blocks. Some piles contained more blocks than others since we only made 4 HRT blocks from our last fabric pair. Each pile contained a mirror set of HRT made from the same 2 fabrics.

I laid the blocks out on my design wall in sections, the same way I did for my HST quilt. I used one pile per section and did my best to keep the 2 blocks in each section that were made from the same fabrics.

Quilt Details

This quilt finishes at roughly 65 x 69 inches.

You will need 4 yards of fabric to back the quilt and ½ yd of fabric for binding.
